This number is only based on the number of people captured and rehabilitated but we know due to the nature of this crime and the miseducation the number of victims is much higher and many go undocumented. According to the national coalition against domestic violence, "between 2009-2011, while other types of homicides decreased, domestic violence fatalities in California increased by 11%." According to Contra Costa Health, "breast cancer is the most common cancer among women in California and in Contra Costa. Breast cancer rates are higher in Contra Costa than in the rest of the state."</b></p>
